OBELISK AWARD ARTIST SIMON WARANCH

Simon Waranch (b. 1999) is an artist in the vanguard of fine art glass sculpture. Blending a mastery of classical techniques with imaginative formal experimentation, Waranch's work reflects his own wit, zest for life, and obsessive reverence for his medium. His love affair with glass has garnered him five solo museum exhibitions and numerous group exhibitions throughout the United States and Italy.

A graduate of Booker T. Washington High School for the Performing and Visual Arts and the College for Creative Studies in Detroit, Waranch's work is already held in prestigious museum collections, and he is represented by seven fine art galleries across the United States and Canada. "At the end of the day," Waranch says, "I just love blowing glass."

Simon has generously agreed to donate 20% of proceeds from sales of today's stunning glass centerpieces, as well as other works of art available on his <u>website</u>, to BCA.







ABOUT BCA LEADERSHIP ARTS INSTITUTE

One of the most prolific areas of BCA's service to the community is realized through it's distinguished board leadership training program, the Leadership Arts Institute.

Each year, 50 diverse business leaders are selected to engage in an intensive nine-month leadership development program. It includes monthly half-day classes at area arts non-profit organizations and a class project. Upon completion, BCA leads one-on-one board matching services.

Panel discussions with arts organization executive directors and their board chairs, discussions of real-life arts board opportunities and threats, and creativity and innovation exercises mark this program that, over the past 36 years, has placed graduates at more than 170 different non-profit arts and cultural institutions.

VISIONARY NONPROFIT ARTS LEADER AWARD

Samuel S. Holland, PhD. is the Algur H. Meadows Dean and an award-winning professor of music at the Meadows School of the Arts at Southern Methodist University. Since he joined SMU 33 years ago, serving as Dean since 2014, Meadows has received national acclaim for its innovative approach to arts education across all disciplines.

A champion of the transformational power of arts and communication, Sam leads a team that is responsible for raising over \$145M in new funding for the Meadows School and has launched groundbreaking programs like the Online Master of Arts in Creative Technology while forging impactful partnerships with major arts organizations, including bringing the National Center for Arts Research to SMU, now SMU DataArts, an initiative to advance high-quality data for arts organizations and advocates nationwide and make a sustainable impact within their communities.

His steadfast leadership, strategic foresight, and dedication to the arts are credited with helping secure AT&T PAC's future as well as the arts and culture ecosystem the Center supports. He led the organization through the COVID pandemic, capital improvements, and partnerships with some of the region's most iconic performing arts groups. Born in Dallas, Danny is a graduate of Harvard College, Yale Law School, and UT Southwestern Medical School and is a 2012 Business Council for the Arts Leadership Arts Institute graduate.



DISTINGUISHED CULTURAL ORGANIZATION AWARD

The Dallas Symphony Orchestra (DSO) is a beacon of cultural excellence and will celebrate its 125th anniversary in 2025. Led by renowned conductor Fabio Luisi, the DSO recently embarked on its first international tour in more than a decade, performing 11 concerts in 10 cities, solidifying Dallas' reputation as a global symphony powerhouse.

Locally, the DSO hosts more than 300,000 visitors every year, a number set to grow with the launch of the Jean R. Johnson Education Center. This innovative new center for students, designed in partnership with the Opera of the Future group at the MIT Media Lab, will welcome thousands of children utilizing cuttingedge technology. This year also marks five successful years of the Kim Noltemy Young Musicians Program, which sets the bar for music education in underserved communities and underscores the DSO's commitment to musician instruction and inspiring the next generation of artists.

The Dallas Mavericks have made a deep impact on arts education as part of their broader mission to positively impact North Texas. A shining example is the Mavericks' Black History Month Art Competition. At a time when high school students often face challenges in staying engaged with the arts, the Mavericks use their powerful brand to inspire creativity and passion.

The Mavericks also engage with students by facilitating visits to the Dallas African American Museum, supporting the Black Academy of Arts and Letters' Summer Arts Institute and productions, renovating a podcast studio for the Vickery Meadow Youth Development Foundation, and are counted as one of Dallas ISD's most dedicated and impactful partners, consistently going above and beyond to leverage their influence for the greater good of the North Texas community.

Since Vari sold its first VariDesk in 2013, the company has been committed to making a positive impact in its hometown of Coppell. The Coppell Arts Center was under construction when it first entered into a collaborative partnership in 2019. These services include providing career resources and hosting educational events supporting local arts nonprofits across North Texas.

LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

Kim Campbell has profoundly shaped the Dallas arts community throughout his remarkable 39-year leadership of the Dallas Winds. His "Have Fun, Make Friends, Be Amazed" motto inspired everything he sought to accomplish with the Dallas Winds. After founding the ensemble in 1985, he shaped the organization into one of the nation's leading professional wind bands. Today, the Dallas Winds has achieved global recognition, with 22 critically acclaimed albums in current worldwide release, with five of them having received Grammy Award nominations.

The band has presented more than 500 unique concerts and developed impactful youth education programs, including the annual Strike Up the Band concerts for Dallas ISD 5th graders and the largest inner-city band camp in the United States. Most notably, upon his retirement in April 2024, Kim was lauded for the successful leadership transition to Michelle Hall, a testament to his careful planning and dedication, to ensure that the Dallas Winds continues to shine for decades to come.





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
